

## **Current NCE Directors standing for re-election in 2017**

Philip Angus, Chair of Nottinghamshire Community Energy

In 2006 Phil was appointed Manager of Nottingham Energy Partnership (NEP), a fuel poverty and climate change charity, and before that was the Energy Strategy Coordinator for Nottingham City Council. NEP has directly helped over 25,000 households with energy efficiency measures through its projects, helping to reduce energy bills and save CO<sub>2</sub>. In 2014 NEP was awarded the Queen's Award for its contribution to Sustainability. In 2016/17 NEP has delivered 2 Battery Storage projects and is a partner in the EU funded Smart Cities program, REMOURBAN. Phil represents NCE on the Board of Mongoose Community Energy Members, the organisation composed of all 12 Societies engaged with Mongoose Energy

Richard Posner

Richard Posner is a partner at a large East Midlands firm of solicitors, with offices in Nottingham, Derby and Mansfield. He has experience of a large community project as chair of trustees of Notts County Football in the Community. That is the charity associated with Notts County football club which undertakes a wide range of projects throughout the city and county. These include the Portland Leisure Centre in the Meadows which has been taken over from Nottingham City Council. The charity's projects now have an annual value in the region of £1m.

David is a qualified Barrister and Chartered Accountant. He specialised in taxation and in advising businesses on wider commercial issues. He practised in this field, in London and Nottingham, for 30 years, before retiring 12 years ago. Since then he has been very engaged with the voluntary sector. He is on the Board of 3 local charities, as well as MOZES (a local Social Enterprise company), he is Treasurer of the Meadows Partnership Trust and provides advice on accounting and business issues and on governance to several others. Kevin Hard

Kevin Hard is a Director and founder of EvoEnergy. Kevin's passion for clean energy and renewables started whilst completing his PhD, and has since built and sold a number of Multimillion pound Solar related businesses. He is a Chartered Engineer, sits on the Board of the Solar Trade Association and is a winner of multiple National Entrepreneur and Business Awards. From inception in 2007 to a circa £30 Million pound business, he built EvoEnergy to be a market leading rooftop Solar Photovoltaic business which has installed Solar on over 8,000 homes and hundreds of commercial rooftops. Other projects have included developing and raising finance for large Solar Asset projects in Social Housing and Education across the Midlands. He is keen to use his knowledge of business, finance and energy to give something back to the local Community.

Miranda Cumberbatch

Miranda is a senior manager at the charity Nottingham Energy Partnership – through successful commercial bids, and partnerships she has secured more than £12 million of investment for Nottinghamshire. In 2008 Miranda was appointed to the Affordable Warmth Programme Manager and since then has enjoyed working at the forefront of community regeneration and domestic energy efficiency in the private sector. Achievements include the delivery of domestic energy policy through a range of projects over the last 15 years and the installation of key energy saving measures for more than 20,000 households across Nottinghamshire including the £4.5m Community Energy Saving Programme in Aspley, the first of its kind in the East Midlands.
